IN APPRECIATION ANTHONY MURPHY



Anthony Murphy is a man of integrity who was popular with faculty, parents and students. He earned the respect of his colleagues by getting people to work together for the good of the boys. He was exemplary at his role as Principal but his leadership during his tenure at Vancouver College extended beyond these administrative duties. He was a true servant leader who modeled, guided, and fostered a sense of community especially amongst the staff so that everyone felt appreciated, valued, and unified. He left a significant legacy at Vancouver College. Vancouver College is grateful to Anthony Murphy, VC's President Emeritus, for his many years of exemplary service to the boys of this school.

Anthony Edward Murphy served Vancouver College with dedication and distinction in different roles for more than twenty-two years. After a nation-wide search for the position of Principal in the fall of 1997, the Board of Directors selected Brother Murphy from amongst a strong field of candidates and he became Principal on July 1, 1998.



► He set in motion a series of new policies and procedures aimed at improving the educational experience of the boys. One of his significant accomplishments was the initiation of the President's Honour Society, which acknowledges and celebrates boys in grades 8 to 12 who achieve an average of 90% or higher throughout the school year. In 2018/19, a record 264 boys were inducted into the President's Honour Society.

In 2002 following legal clarification of the ownership and management of the school, there was a significant amount of work needed to revise the governance structure of Vancouver College. The Board decided that this work, combined with the management of school operations, was too much for the Principal alone. The President/Principal administrative model, used in most Christian Brother schools in the USA, was brought to VC.

Brother Murphy became the first President while another national search found a new Principal, David Hardy, who started his many years of successful service to VC in 2003.

In 2005 the Christian Brothers in the North America Province elected Anthony to the Provincial Leadership Team (PLT), moving him to their headquarters in Elizabeth, New Jersey. He served two six-year terms on the PLT during which he remained close with Vancouver College. When Anthony left VC in 2005 to join the PLT, they gave him the title, "President Emeritus" in recognition of his good work.

In 2013 he was appointed a Trustee of the Vancouver College Trust.

During the summer of 2018, Anthony made the deeply personal decision to leave the Order of the Christian Brothers after almost 40 years of service. He now works for a social agency in St. John's, Newfoundland, where most of his family lives. In November of 2019, he resigned as a VC Trustee.

IN GRATITUDE PRO OPERIS AWARD

In June, the Vancouver College Board of Directors presented its prestigious Pro Operis Award to three recipients. The Pro Operis Award is the Board's only award given annually to acknowledge recipients' extraordinary generosity and dedicated service to the Catholic Education of youth. It is a recognition of the honorees' contributions to the charism of Blessed Edmund Rice and the good work of the Christian Brothers at Vancouver College. (VC '87) has been an active member of the Vancouver College Millennium Foundation since the fall of 2006, chairing its Board of Directors during more than half of his thirteen years of service.



Throughout his service, Mike has been a visible representative of the Foundation at school events while working hard to assist fundraising team through his work on the Campaign Cabinet.

Mike has been an active participant in the activities of the VC Alumni Association and the VC Parents Association, and has given generously of his time, expertise, and financial resources to support Vancouver College. We look forward to his continued participation in events and activities as an alumnus and parent at the school.

► Edward Wright's

contribution to Vancouver College has been truly monumental. He has served on the Board at Vancouver College for 11 years, six of which as Chair of the Board.



It is fair and accurate to say that the existence of Manrell Hall and of the next phase of construction being built is in huge part directly due to Edward's leadership over the past decade. The amount of

work and time that Edward has poured into all things Vancouver College is absolutely remarkable — at the Board level, on many of the Board's Committees, and in the community.

Edward's unwavering commitment, attention to detail, and tenacity in pushing forward are all a gift to the students here today and the many who will walk through these doors in the years to come.

► Nancy Herb began her career at Vancouver College in 1980 teaching Grade One. Throughout the next 39 years, Nancy moved through the Elementary School, teaching Grade Five, Kindergarten, and Grade Two, working as a Teacher Librarian, and ending her tenure as a Learning Resources Specialist.



In her time at VC, Nancy gave 100% in her classroom, encouraging and motivating, ensuring that no student was left behind. She volunteered for retreats and pilgrimages and traveled with our boys for a service immersion trip in Peru.

Her passion for our boys and loyalty to Vancouver College is evident in the admiration and respect she receives from VC staff members, and the visits from alumni who still ask for her when they return to the school.

Vancouver College runs deep in Nancy as the daughter, niece, sister, and mother of alumni spanning 60 years from 1948 to 2008.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE GRATITUDE AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS



We celebrate the successes of our school and graciously thank you for your gifts generously contributed to our community in the 2018/19 school year. We have much for which to be grateful and we thank all who provided their time, talent and treasure in so many ways to help Vancouver College be the exceptional school that it is.

► We are also grateful to our excellent teachers and dynamic administrators who commit themselves to the task of enabling each boy to develop and grow in this faith and learning community.

We are so proud of the accomplishments of our students in their studies, in their athletic and artistic endeavours, and in the many ways they contributed to each other's school life. We are also impressed with the boys' spiritual journey, in the spirit of Blessed of Edmund Rice, by working with those marginalized by poverty and injustice abroad and in our local communities.

We are grateful that the first phase of our redevelopment plan, Manrell Hall was finished on time and on budget. Manrell Hall, the manifestation of our educational vision for learning at Vancouver College, paved the way for the next phase, another building to replace the old, seismically challenged quadrangle.

Construction of this second building is moving at an aggressive pace. This phase features a new elementary school with ten classrooms, a gymnasium, our own Chapel, a new home for the Brothers, consolidated office space for

the Administration, and landscaping of the streetscape and the courtyard. In celebration of our rich tradition, we have preserved two significant architectural features – the Lannon Hall façade and the McCormack Hall arched doorway. We look forward to the completion of this phase in time for the 2020/21 school year.

The competitive bidding process for the construction cost of this second phase resulted in a quote of \$22 Million, 88% of which is fixed. This figure combined with the \$21 Million cost of Manrell Hall brings the total project cost to \$43 Million. This phase is receiving the same prudent management as with Manrell Hall.

On behalf of the Vancouver College boys of today and those of the future, I thank each of you for your commitment and for helping turn our plans into reality. We pray for God's blessings on our students and their families and on our work for the success of this faith and learning community.

I am grateful to our students, parents, faculty, and staff for coming together in the "Pursuit of Excellence" to make 2018/19 another successful year for our faith and learning community.

► Our spiritual life, as expressed through the Essential Elements, continues to grow through Retreat and Liturgical experiences, volunteer opportunities at *The Door is Open* and *Bumpin Bakery*, and our expanding Faith in Action immersion trips abroad. We prioritize these faith and sacramental experiences as they enhance the personal, social, and moral life of our students, faculty, and staff.

Our teachers continue to organize and participate in academic programs and events such as Pi Day, Capstone Project Presentations, Speech Arts, Model UN, Reach for the Top, and Destination Imagination. These experiences enrich the educational experiences of our students, foster personal excellence, and promote higher order thinking skills.

We recognize the excellent work of our boys in our Visual and Performing Arts program, highlighting the VC/LFA production of *Highschool Musical*. Our 4th annual Arts Week showcased work from various students as well as music from our award-winning concert and jazz bands. Our Theatre Performance 11/12 class won gold at the BC Catholic's One Act Play Festival with their student-written and directed performance.

We continue to be proud of our athletic teams for their hard work and dedication to their sport. A few of the many accomplishments this year include a historic season from our Varsity Soccer team, winning Provincials, an undefeated season for our Grade 6/7 soccer team who finished as CISVA champions, Provincial Banners from our

Grade 8 Football, Terrain Giant Slalom, and Track and Field teams, as well as remarkable results for our Rowing Team at National Championships, placing second overall.

Our busy year included a comprehensive school review by the Ministry of Education whose inspection team noted the following commendations:

- our impressive new, modern spaces that align with the needs of the curriculum,
- our dashboard of learning that clearly flows from our Mission and Vision, and
- a visible and integrated Catholic identity in all that we do.

And finally, one of the most memorable events of the year for me was the Blessing and Dedication of Manrell Hall last October. We are grateful to have this brand new building and I am impressed with how faculty, students, and parents have been using the various spaces adding to the teaching and learning experience for all.

OCTOBER 5, 2016 CAMPAIGN LAUNCH

Over 400 people gathered at Vancouver College for the launch of the boldest initiative in the school's history, the **Our Next Century** Campaign.

Students, parents, alumni, and supporters were treated to a festive afternoon featuring games, food, drinks, and musical performances. The formal program of the launch celebration included the announcement of a transformational gift by Tod and Irene Manrell, supporters of Vancouver College. They announced their family's \$5 million gift to the Campaign, bringing the campaign total to \$15 million.

Over the coming years Vancouver College will engage members of its community in a number of celebrations, events, and awareness initiatives as it works to accomplish the goal of raising \$36 million for the campus redevelopment.



FEBRUARY 16, 2017 MANRELL HALL GROUNDBREAKING

Vancouver College broke ground on its new Middle School, Manrell Hall. Formerly the Christian Brothers' residence for 37 years,

Manrell Hall plans for a 44,000 square foot facility, including a learning commons, enhanced dining hall with outdoor features, a makers space for programs such as digital media, robotics, and the Arts, informal study spaces, and 18 larger, more flexible classrooms.



NOVEMBER 2, 2017 TOPPING OFF

Vancouver College and general contractor Haebler Construction Ltd. celebrated the topping-off of the roof on Manrell Hall with a barbeque for its workers in gratitude for their hard work.



JUNE 23, 2018 FAREWELL TO OLD VC

Close to 500 alumni, former and current teachers, family members, and friends were given the opportunity to bid farewell to VC's historic buildings before its demolition and construction on the next phase began.



OCTOBER 23, 2018 BLESSING OF MANRELL HALL

For the eighth time in Vancouver College's proud 96-year history, the school opened yet another new building. Manrell Hall, named after benefactors Tod and Irene Manrell, is the biggest single building ever constructed on campus and was made possible by the generosity that is Vancouver College's community of giving. The Blessing and Dedication was officiated by Archbishop J. Michael Miller, who after the ceremony and official ribbon cutting, blessed the building including the Learning Commons, Dining Hall and classrooms.



MARCH 13, 2019 PHASE 1B GROUNDBREAKING

As construction began on Vancouver College's new Elementary School, the community gathered for a blessing and groundbreaking ceremony.

The blessing, celebrated by Vancouver College's Chaplain, Father Juan Lucca, was attended by Elementary School students, Christian Brothers, and members of the Board, Administrative teams, and the **Our Next Century** Campaign cabinet.



SEPTEMBER 2020 LANNON HALL

The Vancouver College community will welcome our students back to school in a brand new building.

This final phase of construction under the **Our Next Century** campaign not only addresses the seismic and functional challenges of the historic Lannon and McCormack Halls, but will also include a new Chapel, Brothers Residence, Elementary School Classrooms, a new gymnasium, and administrative offices.

We are excited to welcome our community into this new building, and for the completion of the project which will serve the boys of today and those in generations to come.

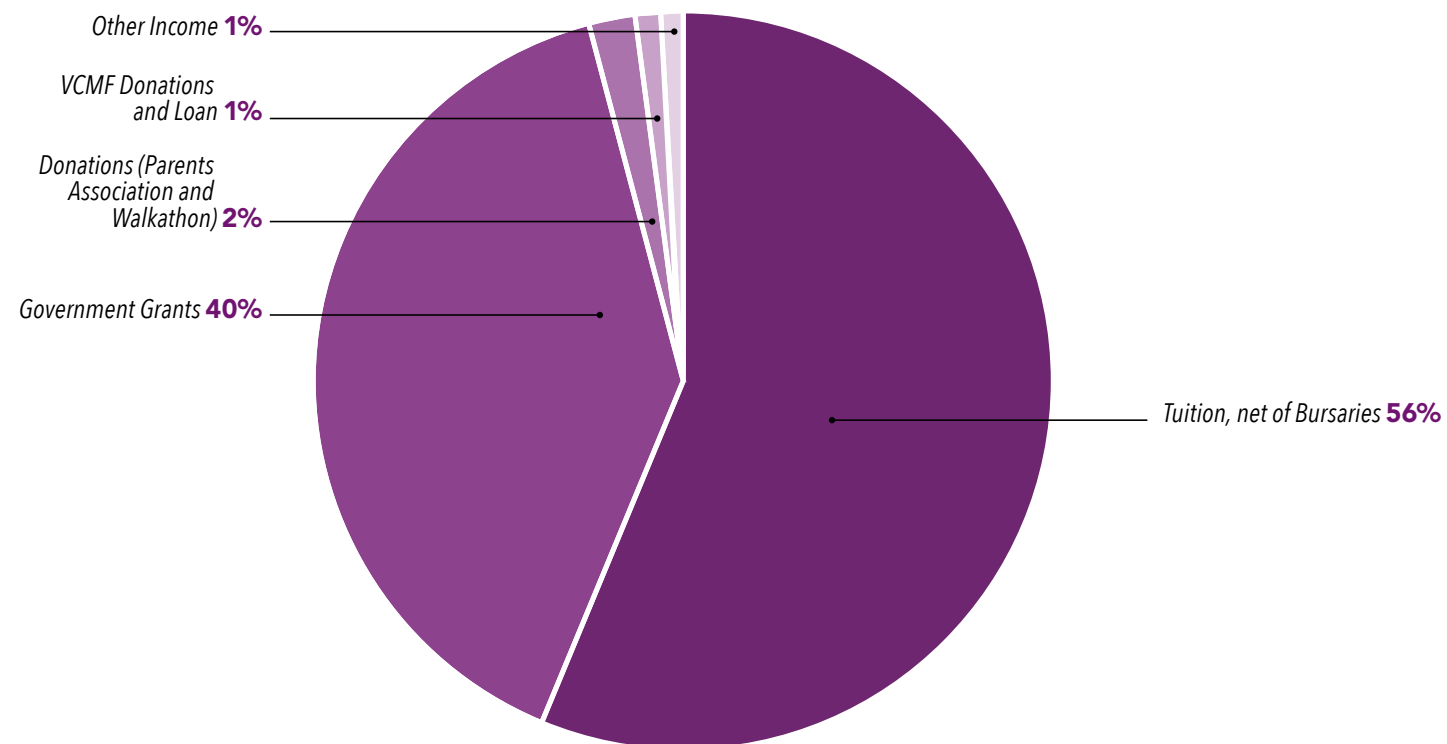

2018 - 2019 FINANCIAL REPORT

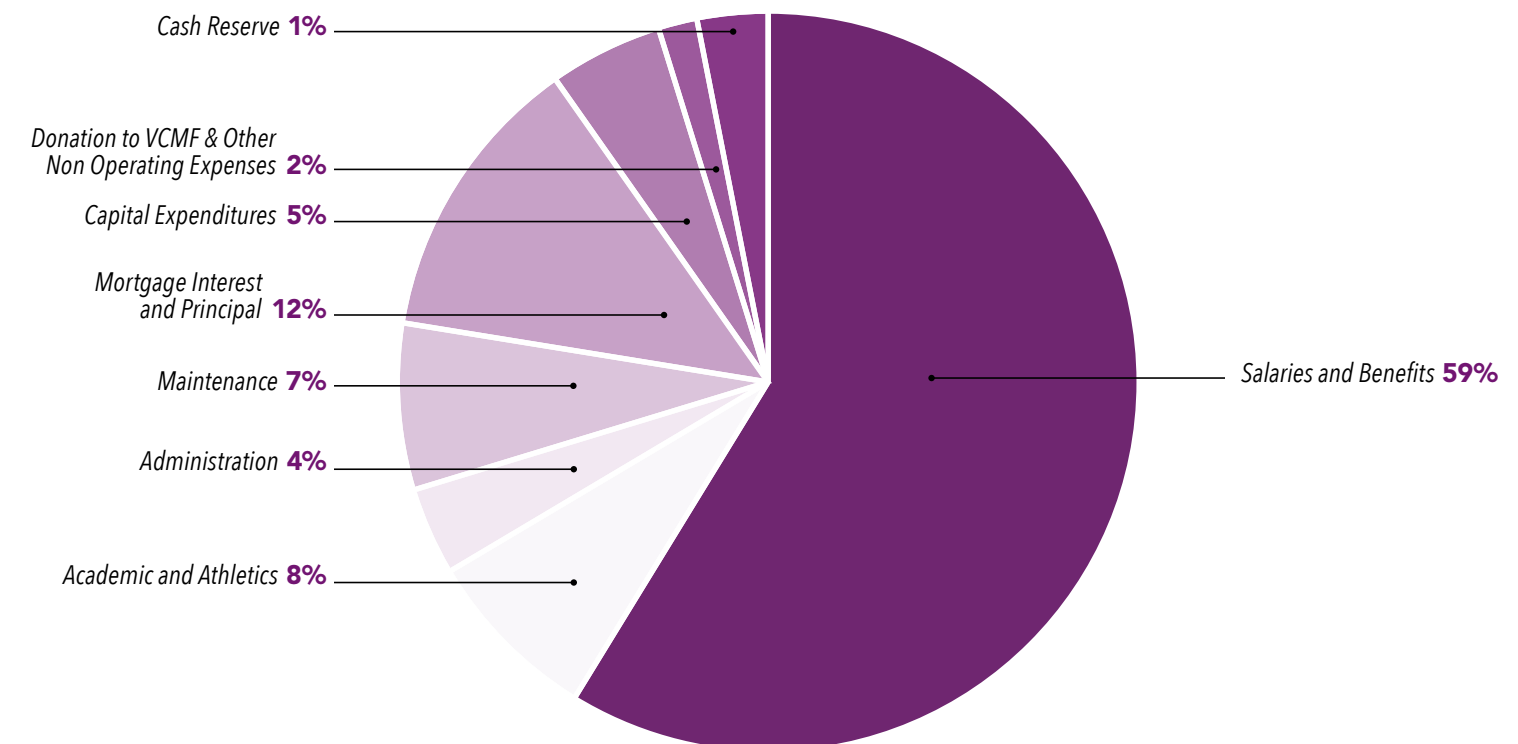
In 2018/19, funding from all sources totaled \$13.14 million, an increase of \$100,000 from the previous year. Tuition increased \$200 per student and Government Funding increased 2.6%. Other sources of funds include donations from Vancouver College Millennium Foundation (VCMF), VC Parents Association, and Walkathon. These graphs highlight the regular operations of the school, excluding the Campus Redevelopment. The Board continues to support the Blessed Edmund Rice Bursary Program to help families in need of financial assistance for tuition fees by providing \$398,954 in funding.

SOURCES OF FUNDS \$13.14 MILLION



On the expenditures side, Vancouver College spent \$11.86 million to operate the school and invested \$1.28 million in capital assets for school operations. The main expenditures for operating the school are salaries and benefits, but also include expenditures on Academics, Administration, Maintenance, and the required mortgage principal and interest payments. Capital expenditures were mainly student-use computers in anticipation of the opening of Manrell Hall. To date approximately \$20 million has been spent on Manrell Hall and \$6 million on Phase 1b. This has been funded by donations to VCFM, through the **Our Next Century** Campaign.

ADVANCEMENT REPORT PROPHETS OF A FUTURE NOT OUR OWN



Every year in the month of April, as many of you may have experienced, we personally meet with around 130 new families. This is a great opportunity for us to welcome parents and share where we are with our campus renewal project and campaign.

Seems not too long ago we explained our plans using renderings on foam boards and now we joyfully ask parents if they've had a chance to visit Manrell Hall. Parents are amazed when we give them highlights of the past four years: in 2016 we launched the **Our Next Century** Campaign, in 2017 we broke ground for the first building, in 2018 we blessed and dedicated Manrell Hall, in 2019 we had the ground-breaking for our second building, and in 2020 we will bless this new building.

All this would not have been possible without the generosity of many families, alumni and friends who have come together to share responsibility in the school's Mission. We give thanks to our community of giving, inspired by members of our Campaign Cabinet under the leadership of campaign co-chairs Chris and Rebecca Sherry, and Chair of the Advancement Committee, Mark Brown. Through our collective efforts, we raised \$6.3 Million in 2018/19 bringing our total for the **Our Next Century** Campaign to close to \$33 Million.

We are hopeful that the 2019/2020 school year will continue to be successful and that we finish strong. The cost of the two buildings is \$43 Million and with our community's ongoing support and unified efforts, we hope to raise as close to this figure as possible not only to ensure completion of the building but also to fortify the school's financial well-being and sustainability for years to come.

Sometimes when working on an extensive, ambitious project, it's hard to fully understand our individual role and purpose. The Romero Prayer is a beautiful, reassuring piece reminding us that each of us plays an important part... that every gift makes a difference... and that sometimes, we just have to trust in Him.

*We plant the seeds that one day will grow.
We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise.
We lay foundations that will need further development...
We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that.
This enables us to do something, and to do it very well.
It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way,
an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest.
